REMEMBERING THE PAST; Newspapers of Ellsworth

The first newspaper, The Ellsworth Chronicle was published on Thursday, September 8, 1898 and cost \$1.00 a year. The publishing shop stood where the Kufus Oil Station later stood. Mr. J.A. Digerness was the editor.



In 1903 J.W. Pitzer took over as editor and changed the name to the "Ellsworth News". F. O. Satter, a very original writer became editor in 1910. He was a humorist and said he printed for pleasure, pastime and pecuniary. Falstaff O Satter had another project - a magazine called "The Squirt Gun" published monthly. By this time the publishing building was where the Medical Building eventually was built.

George (Joy) Hanson bought the "Ellsworth News" in 1915 and published it until his death in 1951. His wife then took over the publishing. Verne Goeldner was the next editor. In 1952, Marvin Brown bought the rights and continued doing so until 1970. The newspaper office continued to be on main street until 1957 when Brown's built a building on Dubuque Street.

In 1967 the "Ellsworth News" became the "South Hamilton News" and serviced the South Hamilton School district. Richard Peters bought the rights in 1970 and moved the business to Jewell.

All copies of the Ellsworth newspapers are housed in the Ellsworth Historical Museum. The newspapers up to 2013 are have been digitized and available on the Museum's website, ellsworthia.us.

PUBLIC FORUM: None Present

ECA: Linda Clark, Marcy Olson, Ashley Platte, and Kayla Knippel were present from the ECA. Request was made for Bingo to donate the cost of a newly purchased microwave in the Community Center kitchen. Motion made by Funk and 2nd by Laube. Roll call votes 4-0. Motion carried. ECA members updated council on results from recent free-will donation fundraising supper, turnout for Halloween event and the upcoming collaborative event with the Ellsworth Fire Department for Christmas on December 14, 2024.

IPAIT PRESENTATION: Caleb Walter with IPAIT was present to discuss municipal investing options. The council will discuss and be presented with a doable figure as a Resolution for the next council meeting.

COMMUNITY CENTER BASKETBALL USE – Travis Anderson present to request gym usage for Thursday in the evening and Sundays in the afternoon for a local 5th grade tournament basketball team practice. Team would offer to set up and tear down tables and chairs to not disrupt Saturday Bingo event. Council discussed. Motion made by Sogard to allow Travis Anderson's team to rent the Ellsworth Gym from November through February for a \$100 fee with \$150 damage deposit upon contract signing, to include Thursday evenings for a 3-hour span and Sunday afternoons for a 3-hour span. 2nd by Laube. Boll call votes 4-0. Motion carried.

FIRE/EMS: Jaysen Evans was present to give the council updates on the old fire station building. He is still acquiring quotes for removal of building, pad and approach. Request was made to order new LED bolsters and lighting for inside the current fire station building as well as replacing one of the furnaces that is no longer in working condition. City clerk will speak with PW Supervisor Vanlangen to acquire quotes through current vendors of the city prior to approval from council. City clerk will put together sealed bidding process for the EFD 69 Pumper truck by next council meeting. Discussion about an emergency credit card for the EFD led to Motion by Sogard to approve an emergency credit card be secured for the EFD, with a limit of \$1200 and a max of \$500 per month unless approved through city hall. 2nd by Funk. Roll call votes 4-0. Motion carried.

LIBRARY: Email from Library director Karlie Hunter requesting adding a "donation" widget to the library's website was discussed by council. No vote required.


CITY HALL UPDATES: Annual reports have begun. City Clerk has a training through IMFOA for Budget Process next week.
